

Precautions - Stop the Spread!

- -Residents with MRSA should have their own dedicated equipment
- -hand washing
- -For patients with MRSA:
- 1.Health-care providers should use contact isolation procedures.
- 2. Visitors also may be asked to wear gowns and/or gloves.
- -MRSA can live days, weeks or months outside of the body on items such as bathroom fixtures, wheelchairs and bedding/towels depending on the environment. Some studies suggest that MRSA can live up to 90 days.

MRSA stands for methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus (S. aureus) bacteria. This organism is known for causing skin infections in addition to many other types of infections In addition, these organisms have been termed "flesh-eating bacteria" because of their occasional rapid spread and destruction of human skin.



SIGN AND SYMPTOMES

-Cellulitis (infection of the skin or the fat and tissues that lie immediately beneath the skin, usually starting as small red bumps in the skin with some areas resembling a bruise).



- -Boils (pus-filled infections of hair follicles) .
- -<u>Abscesses</u> (collections of pus in or under the skin; see Fig. 2).
- -Sty (an infection of an oil gland of the eyelid) .

<u>Carbuncles</u> (infections larger than an abscess, usually with several openings to the skin).

MODE OF TRANSMISSION

MRSA infections can be contagious from person to person; occasionally direct contact with a MRSA-infected person is not necessary because the bacteria can also be spread by people who touch materials or surfaces contaminated with MRSA organisms



TREATMENT

First-line treatment for mild abscesses is incision and drainage. If antibiotic treatment is clinically indicated, it should be guided by the susceptibility profile of the organism.
